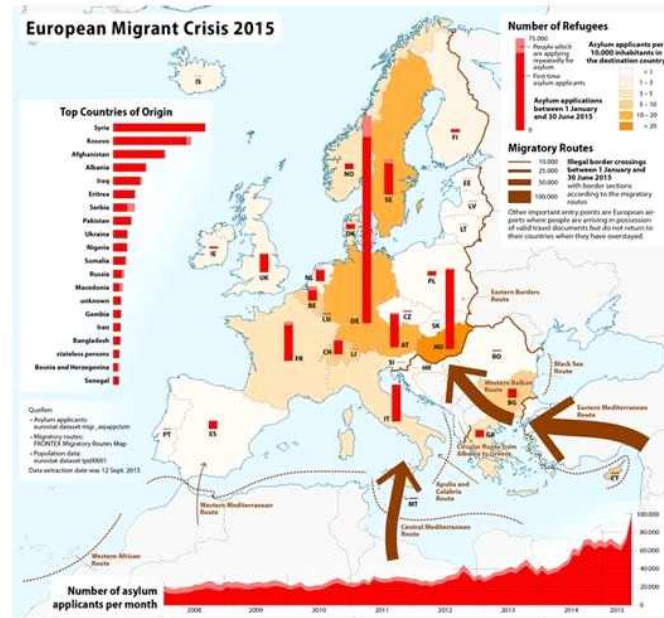
Research on migration in Europe

- **Research on undocumented migration in the Euro-Mediterranean region**
 - **European migrant crisis (2015)**
Syria, Afganistan, Nigeria, Iraq, Eritrea, Balkans
Germany (1,4 mio), France (276,340), Italy (239,455)
 - **War and refugees**
 - 1,1 mio from Ukraina to Germany 2022
 - Migration flows in Germany
2.7 mio arrived, 1.2 departure, 1.5 mio net migration
- Contribution to population growth in Germany since 2014

- **Conceptualising Refugees & migrants**
- Refugee, asylum seeker, forced migrant
- the 'migration-asylum nexus' or 'mixed migration'
- Recent refugees/migrants from Syria, Africa, Ukraine

Research on public perception on migration crisis

- Anxiety around Muslim immigration
 - Political parties: AFD, Liberty GB
 - Far-right anti-immigration group: Pegida, Britain First
 - Anti-racist advocacy group: Hope not Hate
- NGO rescue vessels → See shepherd, Hellenic Rescue Team etc.

Borders in Europe

- Schengen zone
- Boarder regime
- legal/illegal border crossings
- boarder control & closure
- 'no borders' advocates

Debates on the term “transit migration”

The flexibility and ambiguity of the term

- “transit migration” to EU members
- the perceived need to be seen to control undocumented migration across the EU’s external border (Collyer 2014:16)

Criticism on transit migration

1) ‘Transit’ is applied not just to migrants themselves,

→ a category of practices in which they are engaged and regions where they are to be found

- ‘Transit migration’ → as a confused political construction of dubious scientific value.
- Eg. labour migration, education migration, marriage migration
- The term “transit migration” as useful in reference to a migratory phenomenon

Criticism on transit migration

2) Euro-centrism

- Transit within European spaces
 - EU frontier countries, transit state : Hungary, Turkey, Greece, Italy, Portugal, Spain
- As a buffer against illegal migrants and asylum seekers travelling West.
- to pass through Hungarian Eastern border into Western Europe
 - Non-European cases
- North Korean through China to South Korea
- Africans in Egypt & Morocco

Transit migration in Europe

3) “Stranded” migrants (Collyer 2014:17)

- unable to continue, unable or unwilling to return and often facing considerable hardships just to remain where they are.

Recent reflection on migration research

- **Predominantly focused on receiving countries**
 - integration, migration management, policy
- **Works on smugglers, migrants, refugees, human rights experts, police and politicians**
- **Migrants' mobilities**

Research on refugee inclusion

- **Liberal discourse:**
 - the new migrant as a useful and adaptable worker
 - the logic of victimization
 - state infrastructure that manage the inclusion of refugees into the labour market

Recent literature on refugees' agency

- Refugee-refugee relations
 - refugees as active providers of support and solidarity
 - refugees as creators of networks and shared spaces
 - Migrant Solidarity Network
- the agency of refugees is highlighted
 - within wider macro-social structures based on ideologies, religion, class, gender, or ethnicity
- An emerging view of migration
 - as a creative force within economic and social structures beyond the duality between the new economics of migration versus humanitarianism.

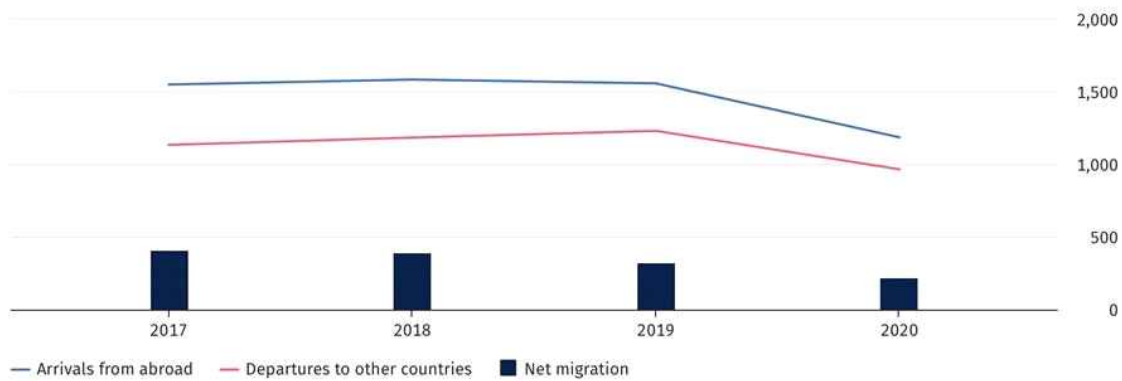
Other researchs on migration in Europe

- 1) Migration and health
 - Migrants' mental and physical health
 - Migrants as a source of disease
 - AIDS, TB (Visa application)
- 2) Changed patterns of migration during the pandemic
 - boader closure
 - Strong decline in external migration
 - The COVID pandemic and discrimination against Asian diaspora
